The Universal Declaration as a word cloud




100+ national constitutions include a right to a healthy environment



Even more recognize the right in legislation or regional treaties



 The exercise of human rights is vital to the protection of the environment.

Procedural obligations

- Protection of environmental defenders
- Freedom of expression
- Freedom of peaceful assembly and association


Procedural obligations

- Access to information
- Assessment of environmental and social impacts
- Public participation in decision-making
- Access to justice (effective remedies)

Substantive obligations

- Environmental standards should:
 - be non-discriminatory and non-retrogressive
 - take into account relevant international standards
 - strike a reasonable balance between environmental and other societal goals
 - be implemented and enforced

International cooperation is necessary to address global threats





Extreme Risk

Protection of the most vulnerable

- Non-discrimination
- Additional steps to protect those most at risk:
 - women
 - children
 - disabled
 - older persons
 - persons living in poverty
 - indigenous peoples and traditional communities
